GUIDELINES FOR AFSC SPRING SHOW SOLOS

The following criteria will be used to determine whether skaters will be offered a solo, feature or specialty number in the ASFC Spring Ice Revue:

- 1. The skater must be a current USFS member in good standing with the AFSC.
- 2. The skater must be currently and actively working toward his or her next applicable skating level, unless the skater demonstrated that extenuating circumstances exist.
- 3. The Skater requesting a solo must register for at least 3 hours of AFSC private ice during the Fall, Winter and Early Spring (October April) sessions in preparation for the show. This date in October is determined by the Fall ice schedule. NOTE: Punch cards and classes DO NOT count towards your hours.
- 4. At a minimum, a skater wishing to perform a solo must be at the **Preliminary Level**. Preliminary level requires the skater to pass **BOTH** their moves in the field test and freeskate test at a USFSA test session before January 1st. It is the skater's responsibility to pay for coaching fees and costumes for the show.
- 5. In the event there are <u>six</u> or more skaters eligible for a solo, the skaters will be chosen by seniority, age, level, ice time skated, and performance skill. Example: if a skater passed their Preliminary tests the previous year and another skater passed in the current year; the skater who passed first will have seniority for the solo, unless another skater at the same level is older.
- 6. One, "Senior Solo" will be granted to each high school senior that is an AFSC Member in good standing. In the event there are multiple seniors, there will be an option to skate in a senior duet or senior number; this would fill in as the skater's "second solo". Seniors who do not meet the 3 hour requirement will get their senior solo but will not receive a "second solo".
- 7. The Skater requesting a feature must register for at least 2 hours of AFSC private ice during the Fall, Winter and Early Spring (October April) sessions in preparation for the show. This date in October is determined by the Fall ice schedule. NOTE: Punch cards and classes DO NOT count towards your hours.
- 8. At a minimum, a skater wishing to perform in a feature group number must be at the **Pre-Preliminary Level**. Pre-Preliminary level requires the skater to pass BOTH their moves in the field test and freeskate test at a USFSA test session **before** the show sign-up deadline. It is the skater's responsibility to pay for coaching fees and costumes for the show.
- 9. These guidelines will be reviewed annually, and the Board of Directors, Head Coach, and Show Chairs.

The Head Coach and Show Chairs reserve the right to modify them at any time, in a manner that is deemed appropriate.
